- how stories both connect as well as form the basis of resistance
- how people engage with other people, materiality, nature and themselves
- how people engage in building and sustaining organizations, businesses, communities and eco-systems
- how organizations are either re-storied or re-narrated for sustainability or how new stories/narratives are crafted and counternarratives/counterstories materialize in new sustainable ways of organizing
- how storytelling can inform how organizations and networks connect with local actors and communities
- stories of resistance and how they reveal inequalities, political interests and authorities.
